Thank you for your Freedom of Information (FoI) request received on 9th July. You wrote:

"Thank you for the response. Please review the response. No details of the agreement referred to in the 2018/19 annual report have been provided (these were being developed at the time that the annual report was published)."

DWP Response

In response to your internal review request, we can confirm that the handling of your original request and the subsequent response, have been appropriately reviewed by someone unconnected with your original request.

As a result of this review we are satisfied that your original request was handled properly and that the outcome was correct. Your complaint is therefore not upheld and the reason for this is as follows:

As per our previous response, in 2017 the Department announced that it will begin to receive a segment of non-UC related Tax Credits debt from people whose Tax Credit claim has ended but who have not arranged to repay their debt and are in work.
