Thank you for your Freedom of Information review request which we received on 4 September. I acknowledge that in this instance, the Department failed to respond within the 20 working days and DWP apologise for the delay. Furthermore, we apologise for not keeping you updated of the progress of your request. DWP is working to avoid any such errors occurring in the future.

In reviewing your request the reviewing officer upholds your complaint as the Department failed to respond to your request within 20 days.

What is the ratio of Work Coaches to Universal Credit Claimants in the following jobcentres -Bridport, Blandford, Bournemouth, Poole, Ringwood, and Weymouth please.

DWP Response:

We confirm that we do hold the information requested for the month of June 2019.

Blandford and Bridport are managed as satellite offices of Poole and Weymouth respectively. As such it is not possible to separate the caseloads out from the "parent" office.

The staffing numbers given are for Universal Credit (UC) Work Coaches and the caseload numbers are for UC claimants only. All figures are regularly reviewed.

Please note: The figures provided for UC Work Coaches are taken from our 'Activity Based Management' (ABM) system.
