You will no longer be paid Universal Credit

Because your circumstances have changed, or you are now earning more money, you will no longer be paid Universal Credit.

The table below explains how we worked this out. If you need more information, contact us using the phone number or address at the top of this letter.

If you're in paid work

- we will continue to check your earnings for 6 months
- your payments will automatically restart if you earn less money or your circumstances change

You must tell us if you don't want this to happen.

During these 6 months, you don't need to tell us about changes to your earnings if you're paid through the PAYE system and your employer reports your earnings using the government's Real Time Information system. If you usually self-report your earnings you need to continue doing this. If your paid work ends during this time you must let us know within 5 working days. You must also tell us if any of your other circumstances change.

If your claim has been reduced due to a sanction or penalty:

The amount of Universal Credit that is reduced by sanctions or penalties may change each month, depending on your circumstances.

How your Universal Credit payments are worked out

This is based on your circumstances between 21 March 2018 and 20 April 2018.

1. First, we bring together the basic parts of Universal Credit that apply to you.		
Standard Allowance for you	£	317.82

2. Next, we take account of any non-work income and other benefits you receive, as well as your savings and capital.
