**OBSERVATIONS**

This case raises similar issues to those now raised in CE/3375/2017 and CE/1083/2018 in respect of work related activity and whether 'soft skills' and 'light touch' activities are compliant with the duty of the Secretary of State under IM v SSWP (ESA) [2014] UKUT 412 (AAC) (IM) to indicate both the least demanding and the most demanding work related activities and if so whether such activities actually amount to work related activity under the provisions of the Welfare Reform Act 2012 so as to make it more likely that the person will obtain or remain in work or be able to do so as per section 13 (7) of the Welfare Reform Act 2007.

**DIRECTION**

Further consideration of this case shall be stayed behind the two cases referred to above until a Judge or Registrar of the Upper Tribunal shall give further directions.
